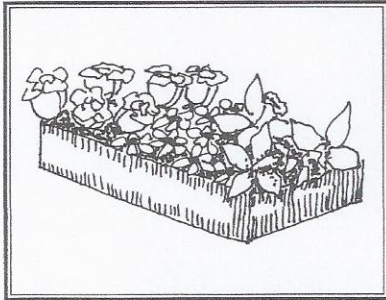

“Kaleidoscope”

Designer’s Choice

1) “Pointillism” A creative design using pave staged in a picture frame provided by the exhibitor. Staged on a table space 24” x 30” covered in white on an easel provided by the exhibitor.



Pavé

Pave is a style of floral design where cut stems etc are inserted into floral foam to form a close packed design with no space showing. Flowers etc do not have to be exactly the same height.

Our design is Designer’s Choice, so you may use fresh or dried plant material or a combination of both.



Class 3: “Loco Logo”

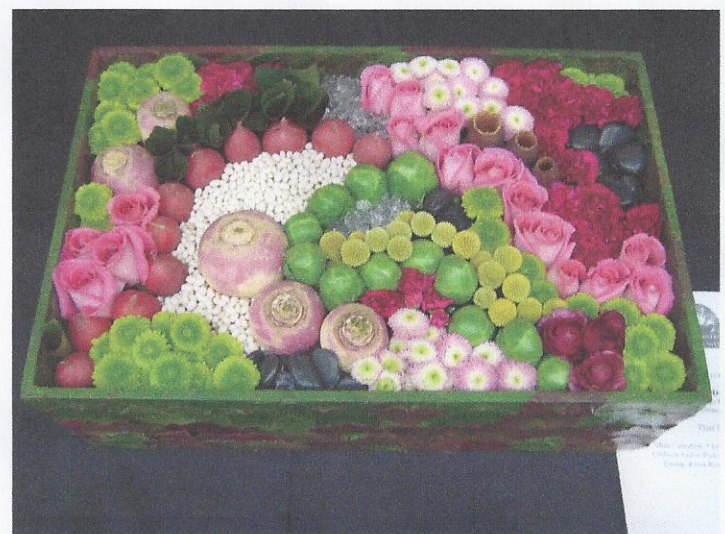
Create a pave’ design of a popular logo from 1988. Fresh or dried flowers and greens permitted. Staged on a table, in a space 30” wide by 24” deep.



Compare these 3 designs from this year’s Capital District Flower Show. See how much more impact the design has when it is supported on an easel (design on extreme right).

Class 7: “Paving the Way”

Create a fresh pave’ design.



Notice that the schedule requirements for these two different classes of pave are different. The logo required more uniformity of plant material as it was trying to depict a picture. The designs at the bottom did not have that restriction. All the designs use robust plant material that will hold up with limited water supply - like if the design is tilted. We are envisaging a picture frame to finish off the edge. You might use a baking pan for your container. Your design can be anything that you choose.
